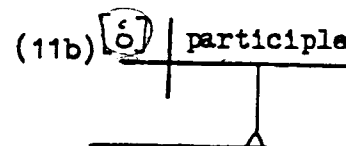
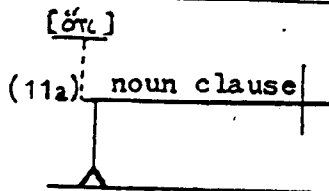
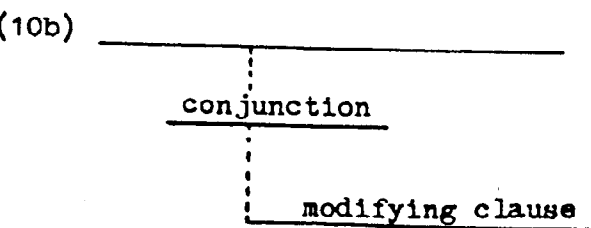
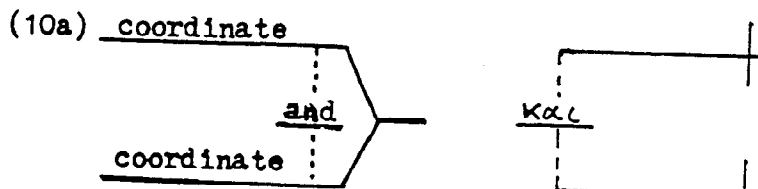
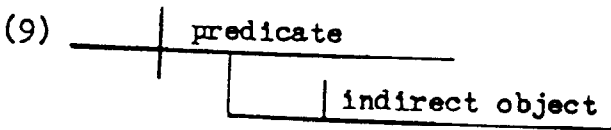
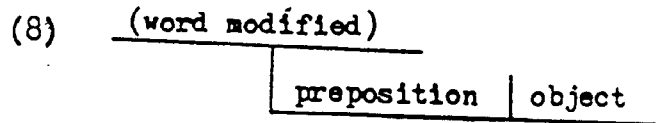
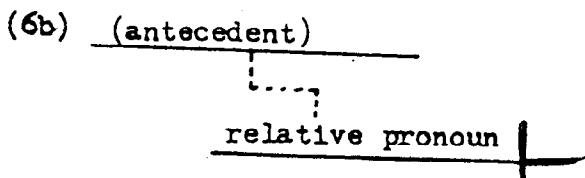
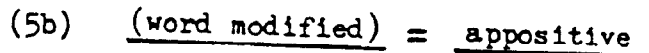
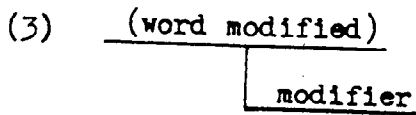
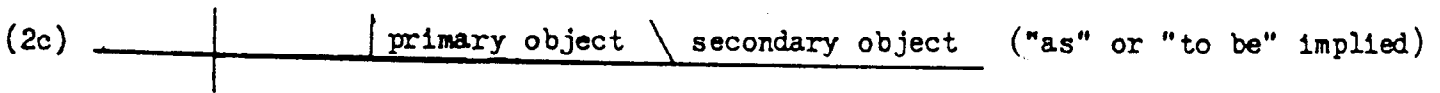
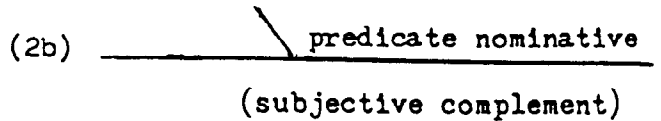
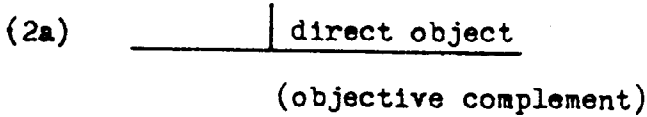
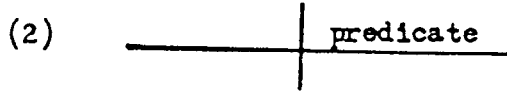
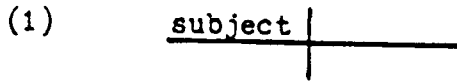


DIAGRAMMING

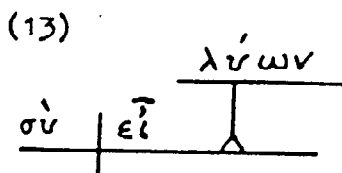
A diagram is a visual representation of the grammatical-syntactical relationships within a sentence. It is employed to enable the student to explain in graphic form the fundamentals of syntax which are basic to sound exegesis.

The student must not confuse terms of function and terms of form. Terms of function include: subject, predicate, complement, object and modifier. Terms of form include: noun, pronoun, article, adjective, verb, adverb, infinitive, participle, particle, phrase, and clause.
